Term 3 of the school year is well underway, and it's promising to be a great one. Paul is teaching two classes at SIBS – Bible Doctrines and the Pastoral Epistles. He has three students in both classes. It's exciting to see their enthusiasm and eagerness to learn. They get into some great discussions in the class. Alen and Grant are looking to become pastors, and Josh is working as an Australian representative for AWANA.



One of the drawbacks of Paul teaching at SIBS on Tuesdays is that Rachel has had to give up her Tuesday Scripture classes. She was glad to do it, but she misses her students. These are the ones that ask such good and challenging questions. Rachel came across her replacement the other day, who expressed to her how much they missed her, too. Apparently the new teacher doesn't sing, and they really miss the Scripture songs Rachel would teach them each week. But she



continues to teach her Scripture classes in Rouse Hill on Wednesdays, and it's been great to see the results from that ministry. We've had at least one family who've become faithful members at our church as a result of the Rouse Hill Scripture classes.

Our English classes are always encouraging, and we're beginning to see our students open up and show an interest in the Gospel. In fact, we recently gave a homework assignment to our students in which they were to bring in a photo and give a description of it. One of our Korean students, Sang Soon (photo – holding Sarah), came in with a picture of Christ and began his talk by saying, "This is Jesus Christ. He is the Saviour of the world." I think we could have stopped there and let him teach the rest of the class, as he proceeded, in his best broken English, to give a presentation on the person and work of Christ. Our hearts are filled with praise to God to see our beginner students professing Christ to one another. Please continue to pray for the rest of our English students, as we reach out to them with the Gospel.
